## PJ Mould Community Park Redevelopment






Council are planning to upgrade PJ Mould Community Park in Wandin North, as the first project coming from Wandin North Town Centre Masterplan.

The PJ Mould Community Park Draft Concept Plan was exhibited between February and March 2024 seeking further community feedback on whether the proposed design reflected the community's values and aspirations. This engagement period was undertaken using a range of formats such as drop-in sessions, advertising, face-to-face engagement with Wandin North key community groups and a Shaping Yarra Ranges web-page for the project.

This Engagement Report summarises the feedback provided by the community during this consultation. The results will inform our final PJ Mould Community Park Concept Plan, which will be exhibited on the Shaping Yarra Ranges web-page

## WHO WE SPOKE TO





4 weeks engagement period for the PJ Mould Community Park Draft Concept Plan were undertaken (26th February 2024 - 24th March 2024)



Face-to-face engagement with Mt Evelyn RSL Club, members from Rotary Club of Wandin, and Mr Mould family member meeting with Council staff who were on hand to provide information and collect feedback.



More than 20 people in total attended the Drop-in session in front of the IGA on the 14th March.


Engagment period question results:

Tell us your thoughts on the PJ Mould Community Park Draft Concept (Shaping Yarraranges Page)

The survey captured responses primarily from Wandin North, comprising 70% of the total respondents. The chart on the right illustrates the distribution of views regarding the overall proposal.

70% of respondents oppose the War Memorial Relocation, with only 10% expressing support for the idea. Another 20% have not provided specific comments on this matter.

Regarding the Toilet Upgrade and Park Upgrade, we have 30% and 40% support respectively, with 0% objections. The remaining 70% and 60% of respondents have not provided specific comments on these two components.



## Engagment period question results:

Tell us your thoughts on the PJ Mould Community Park Draft Concept (Drop-in Session and Face-to-Face engagement)

The chart on the right provides a snapshot of the feedback from residents living in Wandin North, including nearby areas, and other key community stakeholders.

Regarding the War Memorial Relocation, opinions are evenly split, with 38% of respondents both in support of and opposed to the idea. The majority who attended the drop-in session opposed this idea. When we consulted with the Mt Evelyn RSL Club, the committee members expressed support for the relocation. The members of the Rotary Club hold different views on this matter, as reflected in the chart.

33% showed support for both the Toilet Upgrade and the Park Enhancement, while only 5% opposed the proposal. This indicates a potential positive inclination toward improvements in public amenities, albeit with a notable portion of the community remaining neutral or offering no particular comments on these two components.
